Detailed Narrative:

The field visit took place over the phone and the following people were spoken to:

Lisa Hughes, Health and Safety Manager

Neil Virgoe, JHSC Worker Member

*note: the worker member is a driver in St Thomas and the employer is located in London. Due to the distance, workplace parties were spoken to separately. The complainant was also contacted but requested anonymity.

The reason for this visit is to respond to a complaint made to the Ministry of Labour, Training, and Skills Development on April 8, 2020. The complaint alleges the following:

- Drivers are not able to maintain physical distancing when passengers get on or off buses and when assisting para transit passengers.
- -Signs that were posted on buses to inform public have gotten wet and new laminated ones are not being posted.

Inspector Findings:

The workplace parties indicated the following measures and procedures are place:

Information & Instruction to Workers:

Workers have received general training in COVID-19. Hand hygiene and social distancing information is posted in the workplace.

Social/Physical Distancing Measures in Place:

According to workplace parties, there are currently limited social distancing measures in place.

Workplace parties agreed that the recommended 2 meter physical distance is not maintained during boarding and disembarking of passengers.

The employer stated the first three seats behind the driver in the larger buses have been marked to indicate passengers shall not use them and every other seat thereafter.

The employer stated that physical barriers were considered but due to concerns that barriers may compromise the vehicle structure and that drivers would be impeded from exiting the bus, they were not implemented. At

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time of the April 8th phone conversation, no other options to protect drivers from close contact with passengers entering at the front of the bus who currently come in close proximity to the driver have been explored. During a phone conversation with the employer on April 9th, it was stated that the employer is re-examining options for physical barriers. (ORDER ISSUED)

According to the worker member, para transit drivers are in close proximity to passengers while securing wheelchairs in place and then fastening the seatbelt around the passenger. No measures are in place to protect workers during this close proximity interaction. Workplace parties also stated there are no procedures in place for cleaning of wheelchair surfaces prior to touching. (ORDER ISSUED)

The JHSC has not been involved in COVID-19 related discussions with regards to worker safety.

Screening Measures:

The employer stated currently there is no screening of passengers boarding buses with regards to COVID-19 symptoms. Passengers are asked to state their intended destination to ensure members of the public are boarding buses for no reason.

Workers are asked to self monitor and if they have symptoms of COVID-19 they are asked to stay home.

Cleaning and Disinfecting:

Workplace parties stated that gloves and wipes are provided to drivers for cleaning of buses. Buses are cleaned nightly.

Personal Protective Equipment:

Currently gloves are the only form of PPE provided for drivers. Workers are not trained in donning or doffing of gloves. (ORDER ISSUED)

Investigation is complete and orders issued.
